News outlets and sources from all over the country declared that the abortion rate is the lowest since 1974. On the surface this looks like a cause for all to rejoice. Rejoicing is the correct response for every baby that was born, for every mom and dad that have made a decision to continue on with an unplanned pregnancy, and for those individuals that have supported family or friends in the difficult choice of an adoption plan.

It is also important to be fully aware of other variables that may affect that lower number. These include:

- Easy availability to obtain Plan B which is now sold to anyone of any age at any local pharmacy or major store with a pharmacy department
- Recognizing that in the US there has been an increase in women of child-bearing (15-44) age, while in Wisconsin the population has continued to decrease 6% since 1996
- The accessibility of answers for pregnancy prevention through social media contacts and internet sites to anyone capable of using a smartphone or iPad
- Increase in use of other forms of contraception

Two of the most commonly used emergency contraceptive pills are Preven and Plan B. The websites for both of these drugs clearly indicate that each can work to prevent a "fertilized egg" (which is actually a newly formed human being) from implanting in the uterine wall. This

is one of three objectives for both of these drugs which has purposely not been shared with the public. Slanted news reporting and misconstrued facts can easily twist and manipulate readers and hearers perceptions.

In researching current statistics, trends, and demographics for this article, both a Walgreen's Corporate attorney and a CVS pharmacy manager were contacted. Neither was willing to make any comment, provide information, or concrete facts about the number of pills and percentage of increase sold the last two years after the pill became available to the public without a prescription.

So what can an individual do when hearing news?

- Be fully informed about all variables
- Remain prayerful for the generations of young women and young men that are faced with choices and consequences
- Realize the importance of seeking GOD's Word
- Know what GOD says about the value of LIFE at every age and stage.



# CHURCH SPOTLIGHT

Beginning in this Winter 2017 newsletter, we will launch a new feature entitled Church Spotlight. The spotlight will focus upon one of our supporting/partnering churches each quarter. This will provide us the opportunity to introduce our readers to a local church family and recognize the ways that they come alongside the ministry of ECFA.

## **INTRODUCING:** **Beloit Road Baptist Church, West Allis** *“Equipping others to know and grow in Christ”* **Pastor Bill Johnson**

Twice a year for umpteen years, Pastor Bill and his team have opened their arms, hearts, doors, and cupboards to ECFA staff and volunteers as they hospitably share their facilities for the Spring Volunteer Brunch and Almost Anything Volunteers’ Christmas Party.

The history of this welcoming church began in December 1940 when Mr. Horace Woodward, his wife, and their children, gathered children from the neighborhood on Sundays for a Sunday School class in their home located a few blocks northwest of the existing church. Attendance increased steadily until there were over 100 children enrolled by the fall of 1941. Realizing that the Woodward home could not continue to accommodate the growing group, the vision to acquire property and build a church emerged.


The first offering for a building fund was taken on October 12, 1941, totaling a mere fourteen cents. From this humble little offering the group progressed in doing the work needed. On March 31, 1942, they officially organized as “Fellowship Gospel Mission” when the articles of organization were signed by Horace Woodward and four others. The group of faithful church members met in a tent until the dedication of their first building which was built by the men, women, and children of the congregation.

Through the years, a number of Pastors served this congregation. And in 1993, Pastor Bill joined by his wife Ruthann and their two children came to shepherd the flock. Today, there are approximately 80 regulars that attend.



This church is known for their genuine friendliness and warmth. One visitor who returned the following week and eventually became a member described the church as “an extended family.” When asked why his church family is so supportive of ECFA, Pastor Bill did not hesitate for a moment but responded, “We are all in this together. Who wants to see children or families destroyed when there is an excellent resource like ECFA available?” He then repeated, “Yes, we are all in this together.” To which a resounding “AMEN!” could be added.

We are grateful for every person at Beloit Road Baptist Church. Their generous mission support, baby shower event, volunteer hours given to assist in the resale store and office, saleable items donated to the resale shop, event set-up, take down, coffee prep, building shared, masonry repair/painting of the office steps, encouraging notes, and most of all, prayers prayed for all the clients we have been able to serve together as like-minded partners is appreciated.



## TOGETHER FOREVER

For almost 20 years until 2010, Tom and Mary Meyers joyfully volunteered at the original Almost Anything on 76th and Beloit Road. Mary would take most of the donated artificial and silk flowers and create beautiful floral arrangements that she displayed in vases from the unique glass, metal, wood, plastic, or whatever items that were also donated. She could always imagine what would look great together and carefully combined ribbon, lace, netting, or tissue paper for just the right effect. Customers were pleased with her artistic creations and always bought what was put out for sale. Sometimes Mary liked arrangements she made so much she would buy them for her own home or give as presents to her family and friends.

Tom also had his own niche of service. Karen Thoen, our Almost Anything Supervisor, chuckled as she remembered that Tom was definitely in charge of organizing the lower level at the store. She said, "He kept the storage area of donations neat and systematized, especially the hangers." When asked if she meant hundreds of hangers, she quickly said, "No, thousands and thousands. Remember they volunteered here for years. That's why we had dozens and dozens in bundles that we sold and gave away when we closed that store last April."

Prior to volunteering at Almost Anything, Tom worked for many, many, years as an Inspector of small parts at Artos Engineering in New Berlin. Mary was a nurse at Milwaukee County Hospital providing care for newborns including preemies. She even provided initial care for preemie twins that she discovered were her relatives. This was especially meaningful because Mary was a twin too and the family connection to the babies has continued throughout their whole life.



Her next role in life was her most favorite. She became a full-time mother parenting firstborn Laurie followed seven years later by a son, Larry. Years later Laurie married and had a son Kyle which brought another welcome role to Mary and Tom, grand parenting. Kyle married Jess and they welcomed Baby Aria to the family on July 26, 2016. Her birth meant that Tom and Mary were now great grandparents which delighted them to know. Although Tom's health was failing this summer, they all met a few times.

Married for 67 years, Tom and Mary Meyers were a very loving couple that are still together however, not on this earth anymore, but in eternity with their Lord and Savior. In August 2016, Tom died after some medical challenges and just eight weeks later Mary also died very unexpectedly. Their daughter, Laurie, knew it was because her "mom's heart was broken after losing my dad (Tom)." Mary and Laurie had made the decision to have Memorials for Tom designated at his funeral for the ministry of ECFA since they both fully believed in the mission of the ministry for LIFE. At Mary's funeral, Laurie chose to bless ECFA again with Memorials from her mother's ceremony. Laurie also donated many floral arrangements that Mary decorated their residence with to the resale shop again, full circle.

We at ECFA and Almost Anything are saddened by their joint home-going but feel privileged to have known and loved them during their volunteer days (and beyond) smiling at the many fun and fine memories they continue to bring to mind.

## “Choose Life” License Plates A Reality for Wisconsin

On December 7, 2016, Choose Life Wisconsin, Inc., announced it is now an Authorized Group with the Department of Motor Vehicles for the purpose of requesting a specialty license plate.

“The choose life plate has been almost ten years in the making,” said Julaine Appling, Choose Life Wisconsin president. “We are excited that within the next eight to twelve months, Wisconsin pro-life citizens will be able to purchase a beautiful license plate that expresses their views on life while also directly helping our state’s life-saving, woman-helping Pregnancy Resource Centers.”

Choose Life plates are now available in over 30 states. Since the first plate was approved in Florida nearly 20 years ago, over \$23 million has been raised nationwide to assist with adoption and other life-affirming educational work.

In the Midwest, Indiana has raised \$650,000, and Ohio has raised over \$500,000. Both states have over 25,000 cars sporting their Choose Life plates.

Matt Sande, Choose Life Wisconsin vice-president, said, “We have experienced increasing demand for a “Choose Life” license plate in Wisconsin over the last five years. We are confident the plate will sell quickly, and we are excited to open up a funding stream for Wisconsin’s Pregnancy Resource Centers, which offer health services, adoption referrals, and in general help women in crisis pregnancies make life-saving choices.”

The Choose Life Wisconsin license plate originated with Pro-Life Wisconsin and Wisconsin Family Action partnering on the idea and working together throughout the long administrative/legislative process.

“Julaine and I, on behalf of our respective organizations, have been through legislative hearings, floor votes, changes in procedure, legal questions and more over the past six years. We are so happy to finally reach this point,

knowing in the next year or so, Choose Life Wisconsin will begin distributing much-needed funds to Wisconsin’s Pregnancy Resource Centers - our front-line partners,” said Sande.

Choose Life Wisconsin, Inc., is an independently registered Wisconsin not-for-profit corporation. The IRS has recognized Choose Life Wisconsin as a 501(c)(3) organization. Choose Life Wisconsin’s mission is to spread a positive, pro-life message and help Wisconsin’s vital Pregnancy Resource Centers flourish by funding them from the proceeds of the sale of the Choose Life plate.

The proposed Choose Life Wisconsin license plate features classic Wisconsin colors—red, white and black. The graphic on the left side of the proposed design is an ink-print of a baby’s foot, like those on birth certificates. Under the plate number is “Choose Life” in red.



Currently, the Specialty License Plate unit of the Department of Motor Vehicles is working with Choose Life Wisconsin to finalize design details. State law requires that the plate be available for purchase within twelve months of the sponsoring group being approved.

The first time someone purchases the plate, the cost will be the regular registration fee, plus a \$15 issuance fee, and \$25 tax-deductible donation which the state will send to Choose Life Wisconsin, Inc. After the first year, the cost is the regular registration fee and the \$25 tax-deductible donation (unless the applicant wants a personalized plate, which is an additional \$15). Choose Life Wisconsin will then distribute the funds to Wisconsin’s Pregnancy Resource Centers.

“This is a dream that at points, quite honestly, we weren’t sure would ever come true. But thankfully it has. Wisconsin citizens will soon be able to proclaim their pro-life beliefs on their license plates and by doing so help fund on-the-ground organizations that are on the front lines of the pro-life cause,” said Appling.
